WELCOME TO THE 17TH LEGISLATIVE DISTRICT! 2023 SESSION BEGINS JANUARY 9

In case we haven’t met already, please allow me to introduce myself! I am state senator for Washington’s 17th Legislative District, which now comprises part of southeast Clark County and all of Skamania County. The boundaries of every legislative and congressional district in Washington changed earlier this year, based on population, as part of the non-partisan redistricting process that takes place (as required by our state constitution) after each U.S. Census.

I grew up in an Air Force family and have been a Clark County resident since junior high school. My professional background is in the financial sector – which helps explain why I am one of the budget leaders in the Legislature. Also, my husband and I are owners in a local, third-generation manufacturing business; that experience informs my work to make Washington a positive place to do business, which is good for our economy and creates the jobs that support our families.

I hope you will reach out by email or phone if you have a question or concern about state government. The three concerns I’ve been hearing about most, in the past several months, are the sharp rise in violent and property crimes and drug overdoses; the big increase in the cost of living; and how students lost learning because of classroom closures. Those will be top priorities for me and other Republican senators when the 2023 legislative session convenes. We will propose ways to make our communities safer, which includes supporting law-enforcement agencies and blocking new efforts to decriminalize hard drugs; deal with the affordability crisis in our state, and limit government spending to defend against unnecessary taxes; address the education gap caused by remote school instruction – and more, including protecting the rights of people to be their own first line of defense.
